### INK SPOT GREEN GUARDIAN PROGRAM

Last night, Thursday, 10<sup>th</sup> April, Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary's CEO Mr Jonathan Fisher presented Gold Coast company Surfers Inkspot Printers with a Green Guardian certificate, when they launched their new environmentally friendly press machine.

Owners Jim and Suzy Kinsel accepted their Green Guardian certificate after they generously donated more than \$3,000 in free printing to Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary.

Surfers Inkspot have not only been commended on their generosity to charities but also for their environmental practices, last year saving, 592.8 Trees, 113.9 Barrels of Oil, 186,796 KWH of Electricity, 182.24 Cubic metres of landfill, 1,447,896.80 litres of water, less ink, less detergent and less power.

"We are delighted to be a part of the Sanctuary's conservation program, Green Guardian. We've been blessed by having a successful business here and I think it's important to give back to the community to show appreciation. I'm proud of the Gold Coast and I think Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary is such an awesome icon for the city. I think people should get behind that. A lot of people who work there are volunteers," said Mrs Kinsel.

This is not the first time Surfers Inkspot have assisted the Sanctuary, last year they donated 500 programs for their Carols in the Wild event, with all funds raised going towards the Sanctuary's Community Wildlife Hospital.

Mr Fisher is very proud to be partnered with such a fantastic company like Surfers Inkspot and is particularly impressed with their new Green Press Machine.

"It is such a privilege to have Surfers Inkspot as a partner. They have contributed so much already and are an invaluable supporter of the Sanctuary. They also share similar interests with us with their new Green initiative. Their new press machine is environmentally friendly as it uses less ink, less detergent and less power," said Mr Fisher.
