John Flynn Private Hospital shows its care for wildlife

Two hospitals on the Southern Gold Coast have forged a closer relationship, despite both having very different patients.

CEO of John Flynn Private Hospital, Greg Jenke, will be at Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary to officially name the Sanctuary's first male koala joey of the year on Monday (October 19).

John Flynn Private Hospital was the successful bidder for the opportunity to name the koala at a corporate fundraising event earlier in the year to raise funds for the Currumbin Community Wildlife Hospital.

John Flynn Hospital is a 317-bed, acute care hospital located at Tugun which provides a 24-hour emergency care centre, comprehensive cardiac Services, general and orthopaedic surgery, oncology, maternity and paediatrics, renal dialysis, day surgery and rehabilitation services.

The Currumbin Community Wildlife Hospital provides a free community service to treat more than 4000 native animals each year which are brought in by the public, as well as providing a base for collaborative conservation research with University of Qld.
